Important information

General rules

Smoking, alcohol & grilling

are strictly forbidden in sports gyms and accommodations. Breaking these rules could lead to a team being excluded from the tournament and / or losing its deposit. We do not want to jeopardize local support for next year's tournament.



Noise and nighttime disturbance

Noise and nighttime disturbances are to be avoided at all costs. Local residents want to enjoy their long Pentecost weekend. Let's not ruin it with undue noise.



Photo- & Video-Takes

BG Zehlendorf is intending to record photo- and video-takes during the tournament due to justified interests. These records are going to be published on the BG Zehlendorf homepage, on Facebook, and for marketing purposes for follow-up events on selected media e. g. basketball magazines and in social media as Facebook etc.

Lost property

Lost property can be given to the person in charge of the sports gym or entrusted to the tournament office. All lost items must be claimed from the tournament office.

Insurance

Please note the tournament's organizers do not insure participants for any damage to persons or property.

Accommodation – important rules

Steglitz-Zehlendorf local council has once again kindly allowed us to use several schools and sports gyms as sleeping accommodation and as sporting venues. Only respectful and proper use of these facilities will give us the chance to use them – and in consequence put on the Pentecost Tournament – again next year.



Guest Card required

Only participants in possession of Guest Card A or Guest Card B are allowed into accommodation facilities. Participants are required to carry their Guest Cards with them. The tournament organizers will carry out spot checks and reserve the right to sanction people picked up in accommodations without a Guest Card.

Deposit (accommodation) for each team with guest tickets

Each team with Guest Cards is required to pay an additional deposit of 50 Euro to the tournament office upon arrival. All sleeping quarters have to be cleaned and vacated by 10:00 am on Monday. Before a team finally gives up its accommodation, tournament staff will check if it is in good shape. If this is the case, staff will check the deposit-receipt and return the deposit.

The deposit will be returned either in the tournament office (only for Peter-Lenné - J) or at the responsible caretaker!

Cleanliness and cleaning of sleeping quarters

All participants are obliged to keep their sleeping accommodation clean. Cleaning implements and bin bags can be requested from tournament staff.

Food and drinks

Drinking alcohol and eating meals in the sports gyms or accommodation facilities are strictly prohibited. Grilling is also not allowed on any school premises.

Avoiding noise and nighttime disturbances

We expect participants to behave reasonably, both at tournament venues and in public. Please note that between 10:00 pm and 6:00 am German law requires everyone to refrain from making loud noises. The population of Zehlendorf wants to enjoy its Pentecost break without noisy intrusions from the tournament.

Breaking the rules

A member of the tournament staff is on duty in each sleeping quarter around the clock. Their directions have to be followed without fail at all times.

In recent years, we have received an increasing number of complaints from the schools we use. Given this, we wish to point out that anyone who breaches any of the above rules will see his or her entire team EXCLUDED from the tournament IMMEDIATELY and possibly also lose its deposit (accommodation) of 50 Euro.

Shuttle-Service

BG Zehlendorf offers participants a shuttle service. Its minibuses regularly shuttle between the sports gyms, the mensa, and the tournament office. The minibuses carry a big sign on their windscreens. All participants ride free of charge. Please note that all drivers have to obey road-safety rules and can as a result take a maximum of 8 passengers. We would welcome you to wear a mask in the shuttle buses.

It is marked with the letter J on the tournament city map and can only be reached via the side entrance on Hartmannsweilerweg.

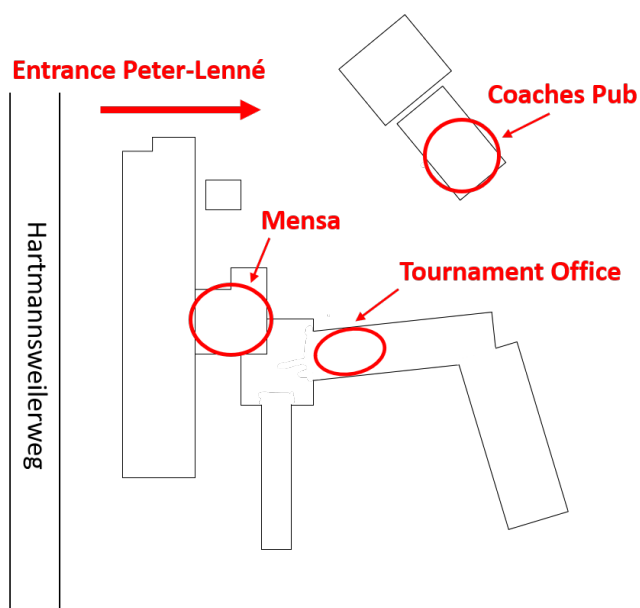

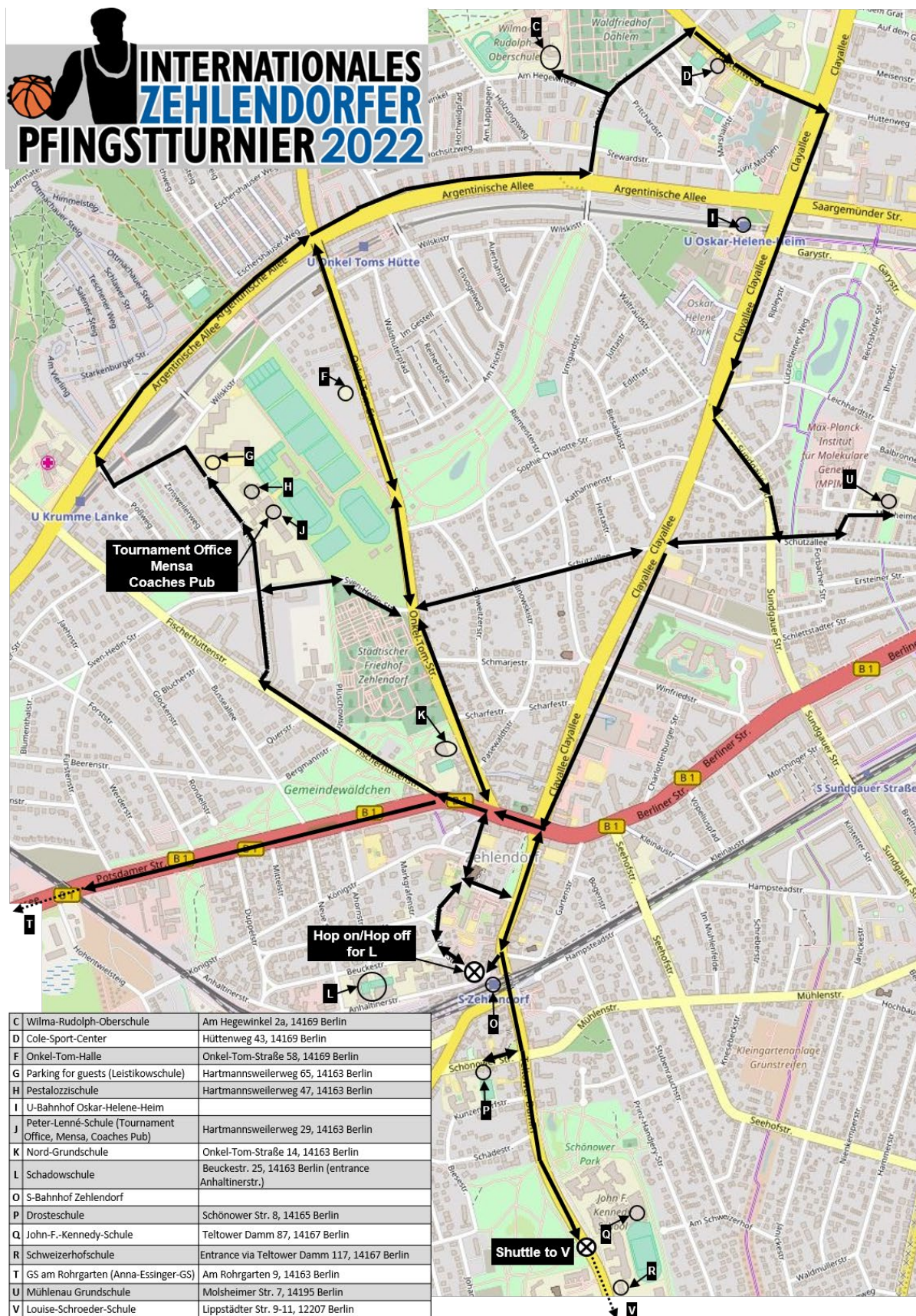

Map of tournament sites and shuttle-bus route



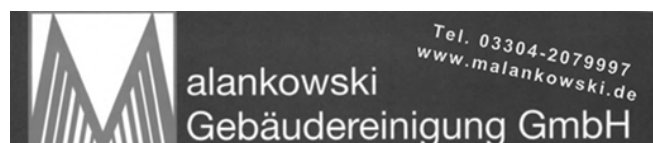
Playing in the tournament

Score- and timekeepers (official table)

Participating teams have to provide score- and timekeepers (official table) for the matches designated in the game schedule. These are usually games right before or right after that team's own game. The schedule for score- and timekeeper (official table) can also be seen online at schedule.bgz.net or in the tournament office. Each team is always required to nominate two people – one score- and one timekeeper.

Team lists

The names of each team member must be declared on the requisite match documentation 15 minutes before the game at the latest. Pre-prepared team lists can also be submitted to tournament officials in charge of the sports gym up to 15 minutes before the match. You can find blank forms in your check-in documents and they can be picked up in the tournament office or from tournament officials in each gym.

Games rules 5x5

Official FIBA rules apply, with the following exceptions:

- a) Playing time is 2 x 15 continuous minutes. Only the last three minutes of the second half are clocked and, during the last two minutes, the clock is also stopped after a basket is scored. The half-time break is two minutes, there is one time-out (one minute) per team per half.
- b) A player who fouls for a fourth time in a game cannot play any longer in that game. After a team gets eight fouls in one half, further fouls are penalized with two free throws.
- c) There is no guarantee for a warm-up period and balls will not be provided for it. If both teams have shirts of the same color, the team named first in the schedule will have to change.
- d) Except for finals in each age group, possessions are not timed to 24 seconds. If obvious violations of the 24-second rule occur, the referee may announce by calling "15" or "20" that he or she will interrupt the game after another 9 or 4 seconds.
- e) Substitutions are carried out without interrupting the game. The incoming player may only enter the court when and where the outgoing player has completely left it. Violations will result in a technical foul being given to the incoming player.
- f) Tied games in the group and placement rounds will be decided by "sudden death" in extra time. All tied games in the final rounds will be determined by which team is ahead after two minutes of extra time.
- g) If two or more teams end up equal on points, the rules of the German Basketball Association („DBB-Spielordnung“) will apply.
- h) Teams have to be on court and ready to play at the scheduled time. Teams that are late or do not turn up will lose the game. There is no grace period. The start of games will not be delayed.
- i) If a team ends a game early and on purpose, or if one of its players turns out to be too old for the team's age group, it will be excluded from the tournament.
- j) A player may only be used in one team per play group. In case of violation, loss of game and retention of the deposit.
- k) Protests must be declared directly to the referee of a game immediately after the reason for the protest has arisen. An explanation in writing must be submitted to the tournament office within one hour after the end of the game. The processing fee is 50 Euro, which will only be paid back if the protest is successful. Beyond this, FIBA rules about protest proceedings apply. The German version of the FIBA rulebook applies.
- l) For all u10-, u12-, u14-, and u16 games, man-to-man defense starting from midcourt is compulsory. Further, please see information below.
- m) U10 and u12 teams will play with size 5 balls. All other female teams and the boys u14 will play with size 6 balls. All other male teams will play with size 7 balls, in accordance with FIBA rules. If both teams in a match agree, these rules can be ignored.
- n) In each game, a maximum of 12 players may participate for each team.

Criteria for man-to-man defense

The following criteria are applicable:

- a) The player in possession of the ball must be guarded closely, at a distance of one arm's length at the most.
- b) The defending players on the ball side are not allowed to sag (deny defense).
- c) Only the player in possession of the ball may be double teamed.
- d) Defending players on the weak side are only allowed to sag up to the imaginary basket-basket line.

The referees enforce teams' adherence to these rules of defense:

- a) A team's first violation of these rules will be rebuked by a referee rightaway, as long as the offense does not lose an advantage, followed by a formal warning that each additional violation will be followed by a technical foul. Afterwards the game continues with the team in possession that had the ball before the call.
- b) A team's second violation will be followed by a technical foul against the team. The foul will be marked with the letter "V" and noted in the coach's column of the game transcript. Technical fouls due to violations of the defense rules are not counted in the event of disqualifications under article 47.1.2.

Games rules - seniors mixed

The regular 5x5 game rules apply with the following extras:

- a) Each team has to have two female players on the court. A violation will be followed by a technical foul against the bench.
- b) Shots made by women always count one point more (also free-throws).
- c) Any block of a male player on a female players' shot will be ruled as goaltending and counts as a made basket.
- d) All teams will play with size 7 balls.

Games rules 3x3

The official FIBA 3x3 rules apply.

- a) The shot clock is 12 seconds.
- b) If a team has scored a basket, the game continues immediately.
- c) The ball must be fitted or dribbled behind the 3-point line after a basket or steal, but may be defended directly (except in the no-charge half-circle).
- d) Playing time is 10 minutes.
- e) All field baskets and free throws count 1 point within the 3-point line and 2 points outside.
- f) Each team consists of 3-4 players, of which 3 are always on the field. A maximum of one substitution player is allowed.
- g) Each team has a break of 30 seconds per game.
- h) The first possession of the ball is decided before the start of the game by a toss.
- i) Overtime: the first team to score 2 points wins.
- j) When fouled during a shot, there is one free-throw or two, when shooting outside the 3-point line.
- k) 6 team fouls are allowed. From the 7th team foul there are 2 free-throws for the fouled team. From the 10th team foul there are 2 free-throws plus ball possession for the fouled team.
- l) After a dead ball, there is a check-ball at the top of the 3-point line.
- m) After a jump-ball situation, the defending team receives the ball.
- n) A player substitution is only allowed during a dead ball.
